

Proposed Boardwalk – French Harbour

Wednesday 1st March

from 16:00 - 18:00 at the Top of French Harbour Slipway

There is a harbourside path which provides a route for walking and cycling around most of the harbour which links to walking and cycling routes to the west and to Havre des Pas. There are two gaps in this route at the English and French Harbours which creates risks for people trying to cross there. The Department for Infrastructure (DfI) are working on schemes to provide new paths in those locations to close off the gaps. DfI have firm plans to build a 1.8m pavement / cycleway behind the English Harbour wall in 2017. This work will take place wholly within the carriageway and can be carried out without the requirement of planning consent.

The road and pavement width around the French Harbour is not as wide as that around the English Harbour and we are unable to construct a pavement on the roadside by the harbour wall. DfI are therefore proposing a boardwalk which is felt to have the minimum impact to the heritage wall. The boardwalk will span over the harbour wall and will be supported off columns on the slipway. The columns would be placed so that vehicles can still park on the slipway.

DfI are holding a public drop-in session and would welcome your feedback on the proposals. Analysis of the feedback will help inform the planning application.
